Aims of FHCS

- **#1** Record information relating to the Ford to Hunston section of the Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation (the canal) and associated waterways.
- **#2** Maintain access to the canal footpaths and restored remains.
- **#3** Preserve, restore and maintain the line of the canal and features along it.
- #4 Support the establishment of a Greenway along the route of the Ford to Hunston Canal if it substantially preserves the line of the canal and the features along it.

FHCS activities

Our activities are currently divided into the following topics: Planning & Developments, Projects including bridge and artefact repairs, Workdays, Exhibitions, Guided Walks, and administration.

Planning & Developments

Currently, there are three large new housing developments on the canal route

that have significant implications for one or more of our 4 aims. These are:

- (b) Ford Landings, Ford & YaptonParishes, (Developer: Vistry GroupLtd) vistryhomesford.co.uk,
- (c) Charmans Field, North Mundham Parish, (Developer: to be confirmed)

All 3 developments have had input from the Society, with Drove Lane the most advanced in implementation.

Projects

In April we carried out brickwork repairs on Tack Lee Bridge in Yapton village.

Thanks go to all who attended. On Saturday 24th August, we plan a walk between Ford and Yapton to look at the implications of the Ford Landings development led by Vistry Group Ltd. We
